Entering your Images

All entries should be submitted online at www.OnlineJuriedShows.com.

Three dimensional works may submit up to two (2) images per piece.

For best results, make sure your image is 1920 pixels @ 72 dpi on the longest side. Images should be in JPEG format, sRGB color space.

Artist Eligibility

Any Mississippi artist is eligible to participate.

Entry Eligibility

If selected for the exhibition, you must be able to deliver and pick up artwork or provide shipping arrangements (packaging and expense) to and from The Cedars.

All work must be available for sale.

All work must be your own original artwork, created within the last three years.

2-D work must be wired and ready to hand (no saw tooth hangers).

There is no size restriction.

Accepted 3-D work might be requested to be delivered with its own stand/pedistal for display.

Accepted work includes:

Drawings: pencil, colored pencil, oil pastel, chalk pastel, pen and ink, etc.

Paintings: oil, acrylic, watercolor oil pastel, etc.

Photography: digital and film

3D: wood work, assemblage, sculpture, pottery, fiber/textile, etc.

Mixed Media: collages, encaustic, printmaking, etc.

Fees

\$30 for the first entry and \$5 per entry thereafter up to 5 entries total

Juror

William Ishmael, native of Kentucky and resident of California, is the juror for the 2020 Cedars Juried Art Show. Ishmael has been an artist for the last 30 years, beginning with watercolor landscapes and progressing to large abstract works and art installations utilizing latex paint, sand, organic materials, and the natural elements of the weather to achieve the weathered, multi-layered effects on many of his works. His work has been featured in many galleries in the Pacific Northwest including the Morris Graves Museum of Art ("Wholeness and Fragmentation" September 2018). He has been a juror for several exhibits in California. From 2017 – 2019, he was Chair of the Art in Public Places Committee for the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission. In 2011, he was named Artist of the Year by the Sacramento Art and Business Council.

All work submitted must be available for sale. The Fondren Renaissance Foundation will retain a 40% commission on all sales.

About The Cedars

The Cedars is Jackson's oldest standing residential structure. It was saved from destruction and restored by the Fondren Renaissance Foundation and a host of individuals and corporations in 2003. Originally, it was part of the Garland Plantation and built in 1840. Today, the Foundation maintains ownership of the property and its grounds complete with majestic cedars for which it was named. While know by the community as the site of picturesque weddings and receptions, The Cedars is best known for its visual and performing series: its art gallery shows and Symphony at Sunset – both widely praised cultural community events open and free to the public.
